

ONE MORE UNWORTHY CANDIDATE.

David Bacon, Democratic Nominee for Commissioner of the State Lead Office, Has a Bad Record as Shown by a Deed Station Delivered by Judge Cooley.

The following opinion was delivered in the Supreme court of Michigan at the January term, 1877, by Chief Justice Campbell, all the other Justices concurring. It was then composed of Cooley, Cooley, Marston and Graves.

The details of the case are given fully in the opinion and the facts need no elaboration to prove David Bacon, one of the defendants in this case, unfit for any office, much less the office of state land commissioner, to which he was nominated by the state Democratic convention.

The facts in this case may be summarized as follows: In April 1871, the complainant was in possession and claimed to be the owner of two parcels of land in the county of Van Buren, one of which was known as the south half of section four north, range sixteen west, containing 80 acres, and the other as the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of section three, in the township of Cadebuch, containing 40 acres.

These had been purchased in 1850, the first one Hathaway; and the second one Hicks, taking in each instance a warranty deed, and supposing he was obtaining a perfect title. The deed was originally patented by the United States to Isaac George, who conveyed them to George Thompson in 1836. This conveyance was fully recorded. It is shown in this case that Thompson sold this land off to one Cadebuch and conveyed it; but this conveyance was never recorded and is not Hathaway or Hicks could trace the title back to the original complainant, but that they derived title from Cadebuch through unrecorded conveyances.

It will be seen that the facts in this letter differ from those claimed by the complainant, and that they do not cover the facts of the land as occupied. The letter instructed Thompson to execute a deed as requested, and it was transmitted to Bacon, which was a fraudulent deed, and that Bacon, on whose behalf it was solicited, was in no manner benefited by it.
