WALL STREETS' WOE

Another Great Victory for Gould the Wizard.

Three Heavy Failures on the Stock Exchange and Many Banks Involved—A. H. Hunt's Panic's suppressed.

New York, Nov. 11.—High rates for money and the abnormal stringency in the bond market finally resulted today in a panic among the working institutions on the stock exchange. J. M. Whitney & Co., bankers and brokers, assigned this morning. At 2:15 the failure of Decker, Howell & Co. was announced, and just before the close of business David Sigmond announced his resignation from his obligations. When the signal sounded for the traders to disperse all breathed easier and congratulated themselves on the matter not being worse.

On the morning of the 11th, J. M. Whitney & Co. has snatched a signal victory from the demoralization he is credited with having brought about. "The Wizard," as he is called, has secured control of the Union Pacific, and will at his convenience lift the scale of the gold and silver market, and represents the historical house of Adams.

The hurry was furious for some time today and Villard's severely suffered, but at the end of the session confidence was partially restored.
