

Her Label Suit Against the Inter-Ocean for Publishing a Libelous Article is Being Outfitted by the Lawyers and the Witnesses.

CHICAGO, Nov. 19.—The trial of what promises to be the most sensational libel suit ever heard in this city was begun in Judge Baker's court yesterday. It is Mary Ryan's \$50,000 case against the Inter-Ocean for publishing a libelous article in its columns, charging her with blackmail and in adventures, and stating that she had pursued with the relentless of a tigress some of the wealthiest and most prominent Chicago citizens, bleeding them of large sums of money which she had secured by means rather than that public notice should be brought to them.

The plaintiff, who was formerly a resident of Grand Rapids, Mich., where she had been married to a man of the name rather than plainly attired well developed woman, with an attractive face. She has acted as a book canvasser. A large crowd attend the proceedings, not a few of the ladies present being the wives of the alleged black-mailers. Over 100 witnesses have been summoned by the Inter-Ocean, among them some of the most prominent successful states. Others are said to have been summoned to avoid the publicity their names would give.

The Inter-Ocean has been threatened with being attacked for contempt before they would consent to appear.
