THE OVER-POWERING ISSUE.

One of the changes he advocates is a law giving National banks the privilege of issuing notes to the full par value of the National bonds they have on deposit with the treasury. This would add \$100,000,000 to the circulation.

Other plans are proposed which would give an additional circulation of \$200,000,000. These plans, however, run counter to the idea with which the people are becoming imbued that the paper currency should be issued by the government, and they ignore the plain, common sense plan of free silver coinage. Free coinage would at once give us an inflation equal to that proposed by the Secretary, and the benefit to the coun-

try cannot be overestimated. The debtor class, who comprise at least seven-eighths of the people, and whose names are now again on the debit side, would find their burdens lightened, money would be plenty, new enterprises would start up, new life be put into old ones, and the cry of unemployed prospectors would be heard no more.

That these things are talked of does not, however, guarantee their immediate performance. The moneyed interests have so strong a hold upon the senate that they will not permit their interests to be sacrificed to the benefit of the people. But the people are moving, and their voice will be heard, and the party which heads it first is the one which will carry the day.

CO-OPERATIVE HOUSEKEEPING.

The Scheme Which Will Be Carried Out in West Philadelphia.

The wave of co-operative enterprise is sweeping over Philadelphia now, and soon will be sweeping over the rest of the mutual plan. A circular was prepared by Dr. John Taylor which is being distributed to the members of that neighborhood for signatures, and as soon as a sufficiently large number of names are signed the contract cooking plan will be established, and services in private dwellings will be dismissed. The following is a copy of the circular:

"We, the undersigned, having formed a favorable opinion of the plan of co-operative housekeeping, and our willingness to help form an association for that purpose when as many as ten families or thirty persons will agree to join it. We also agree to attend all the meetings necessary to effect an organization of the society."

A number of names have already been subscribed, and the promoters of the undertaking are very sanguine of securing the signatures of a large proportion of the neighborhood population. Meetings are held weekly at the residence of Dr. Taylor, and a permanent organization will be formed.

The association is in communication with similar concerns in western cities, and the Philadelphia system will differ somewhat from all others now existing. The idea is not so much to secure cheap living as to do away with individual housekeeping, and to have a central charge of the central culinary establishment will purchase all provisions necessary, hire the needed help and collect from each family its proportion of the expenses. The families will be charged according to the number of persons each household contains. Families with children and very small children. After the lapse of a few weeks the association will settle upon a regular weekly rate.

Purchasing food and provisions in wholesale quantities, the association will buy at a much lower rate than that charged by the family grocery store. Each other table their meals at private tables contained in booths in the main dining room of the central supply house or have their own table in their own dwellings. The former place is the one usually selected, and can be carried on as cheaply as the latter.

Speaking of the association and its future, Dr. Taylor said last night: "If the plan works, as we have no doubt it will, it will be a great benefit to the city. It will establish a laundry, dry-cleaning plant and house heating apparatus, gas systems to be had from central supply houses for each square. The dwellings are built as usual, with the exception of the dining room, which is built away from the main structure and along a covered aisle leading from the central house to the middle of the front of the square. The dining rooms are one-story structures, and they are connected with the main dwelling by little archways. Thus each family sets in its own dining room, but is served from the common supply house."
