FOUR MORE OR LESS NOTORIOUS CONVICTS RELEASED.

Tom Navin and Harry McDowell among the Number—The Governor's Record Compared With That of His Predecessors.

LANSING, Dec. 31.—Governor Luce broke his daily record and yesterday sent four prisoners of executive clemency to men in the prison at Jackson.

His excellency gave way to the entreaties of the influential friends of Tom Navin, the "kid" ex-convict of Adrian, and that young man walks from behind the prison walls today a free man.

The governor explains his action upon the grounds that the willingness of the wrongdoer that he be pardoned and the desire of representative men that he be let out.

Then Navin's mother, who was left alone by his father's death, is in impaired health, and there are other pathetic reasons why he should be let out.

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THE SEALING PROBLEM

AS VIEWED FROM OPPOSITE SHORES OF THE ATLANTIC.

Claims Assorted by the United States and Great Britain in Behring Sea—An Explanation of Secretary Bayard's Memorial Action.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 31.—Great Britain emphatically and plainly upheld its position on the right claimed by the United States to control the Behring sea in the protest filed with Mr. Blaine last June.

It will disclose a humiliating condition of affairs, and one which will be very difficult for partisan defenders of administration to attempt to sustain.

The position of the United States is summarized as follows: The Pribilof Islands in Behring Sea are a part of Alaska and belong to the United States.

These islands are the breeding places of fur seals, which resort to them every summer and remain three or four months, the rest of the year being spent in the open sea.

Within the last six or seven years many vessels from British Columbia have followed the seals from the Pacific ocean into Behring Sea, as they moved toward the Bering sea for the purpose of killing them and obtaining their skins.

The government of the United States has seized and confiscated many of these British vessels and inflamed fines and imprisonment on their officers.
