ANTI-MONOPOLY THE ISSUE.

If it be proved true that the Democrats in the Kansas legislature are ready to join the Republicans against the Farmers' alliance to re-elect locally, it will be the end of the Democratic party in Kansas, and the contestants in future elections in that state will be Republicans against the farmers.

This is not very unlike the situation in Nebraska, where the recently elected Republican state officers are siding with the Democratic governor to elect the farmers' state ticket and to oust Governor Thayer.

In South Dakota the Democrats and farmers are united against the Republican state government, some are tax-reformers, and some are free traders. This is also true of the anti-monopoly issue Democrats and Republicans are divided within their party lines.

A Farmer's alliance can be anything on the tariff question except a high protectionist, but he cannot be mixed on the money, land and transportation questions. On these he must be clear and positively against the pretensions and claims of land grabbers, abuses of railroad management and banks of issue.

These are the questions which will divide most politically, no difference in their party choice is lost. The tariff is not strong enough to keep such Democrats as Gorman and Hampton apart from Cameron and Isgals, but the anti-monopoly issue is strong enough to put farmers and mechanics in solid line against all comers.

DEMOCRATIC Indiana and New York now fall in line with the southern states and table a bill appropriating money for the Columbia fair until the fate of the force bill is decided. If that force bill passes the fair may be a Republican exhibit altogether. This would be a queer feature in the election of 1892 and we doubt if it would help the Democrats any.
