RESOLUTIONS DENOUNCING THE DEMOCRATIC STEAL.

Report of the Committee on the Coldwater School Newark to be Honoured—The Democratic Gerrymandering Scheme.

LANSING, Feb. 25.—Upon convening the following report of the committee on the state public school at Coldwater was read by Representative Doremus:

"We have visited the State Public school at Coldwater, inquired into the management of the same, and investigated the circumstances under which Nellie Griffin and others were allowed to be taken from the school."

"We find that Superintendent Newark has charged the school for about one year and a half, and that so far as the internal affairs of the school are concerned, he has ever been watchful for the best interests of the children committed to his care."

"It is not stated that he did not always so much care been shown in finding suitable homes for the children of the school, nor in seeing that children sent from the school were safely delivered at their destination. In fact, the committee have evidence adduced that there have been a number of cases of gross carelessness in these respects; that there have been violations of the expressed provision of the law, and that before a child should be taken from the school and placed in any home, the application of the person desiring such child, duly endorsed by the board of control, should be sent to the superintendent of the school. We find that in seven cases during the administration of Superintendent Newark, and in 12 cases during that of his predecessor, this application was not endorsed and filed."

"In all these cases we believe that the board of control have been derelict in their duty. In the case of Nellie Griffin, upon County Agent Taylor—most rest the blame."

"The committee believe that had Superintendent Newark observed the plain requirements of the law, in letting and giving Nellie Griffin to go to her mother's well-known home, the result in showing the said child to be an impostor, and the loss of the property of the premises, this committee believes that for the negligent management of the school, the members of the board of control are liable and should be held responsible. In view of the above provisions it is to be appalled and remove a superintendent, are justly due and should be taken into consideration by his gross carelessness in the case of Nellie Griffin case, now removed from the school."

- Eighth—Alcona, St. Clair, Sanilac and Huron.
- Ninth—Tuscola, Bay, Midland, Gladwin, Roshto, Ionia, Cheboygan, Arenac, Iosco, Ogemaw, Oscoda, Alcona, Alpena and Montcalm counties.
- Tenth—The cities of Grand Haven, Newaygo, Mecosta, Isabella, Grandtand Montcalm counties.
- Eleventh—Mason, Lake, Oceola, Charlevoix, Roscommon, Missaukee, Washtenaw, MacLeary, Benzie, Grand Travers, Kalamazoo, Allegan, Jackson, Van Buren, Newaygo, Genesee, Oshtemo, Calhoun and Houghton counties.
