

MR. CLARK EXONERATED

NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR THE "DAMNABLE CONSPIRACY"

Yesterday Produced No Change in the strikers' Prospects - The Conspiracy Alleged Today.

Fred S. The MORNING PRESS does not desire or intend to accuse Mr. Clark or any other person wrongfully, and as an evidence of this intention it has today squarely, it hereby retracts the charges made against Mr. Clark.

During the day yesterday nothing in connection with the strike occurred to which attention should be directed in the Sweet street trouble. No more arrests were made although reports say there were 137 warrants out for various citizens charged with conspiracy.
