TRAINING THE KILLER BLAINE

THE ADMINISTRATION ORGAN IS STILL ATTACKING HIM.

Hale's Denial is Decried—Alleged That Minister Montt Was Deceived—Blaine's Retirement From the Cabinet Predicted.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 4.—The Post, Frank Hutton's paper, and generally looked upon as to a large degree the official organ of the administration, continues to give considerable space to Blaine's alleged backbiting of the president during the Chilean imbroglio, and editorially is very bitter against the secretary.

Senator Hale denies the sensational story alleged to have taken place at dinner at his house, and says that Mr. Blaine did not make the speech attributed to him. Very many people, however regard the denial as the perfunctory duty of a host to his guest.

The Post alluding to Mr. Blaine's denial characterizes it as "a cowardly and bubbly" as "wearing, because of its weakness, a chest protector in front and a porous plaster behind," and finally as a denial that "leaks at every pore."

It is known that the president is still very angry over the way Secretary Blaine compelled the nomination of the reply of Chile to be acceptable, and this, coupled with a fear that Blaine will not accept the nomination of Horace, is sufficient, they argue, to make Blaine's resignation desirable to the president, and to prevent any other diplomatic stroke.

OTZAWA, Ont., Feb. 4.—There has been considerable speculation during the last two days regarding the meaning of a special meeting of the cabinet minister Blaine. It is stated that afterward that a communication had been received by Lord Stanley from Sir Julian Pauncefote conveying the expression of a desire on the part of Secretary Blaine to reopen the discussion trade relations with the United States and Canada, which were suddenly interrupted last fall.

A SPANISH CYCLONE

A High Wind Flays Havock And Does Much Damage In Madrid.

MADRID, Feb. 4.—A hurricane sweep over this city last night and did much damage. Houses were unroofed, chimneys toppled over, signs and awnings blown down, and the streets were dangerous. Dozens of people were injured by flying fragments and taken to the hospital. The telegraph stations were prostrated, and communication with the rest of Europe is barely maintained.
