LUXURY AND LABOR.

LAVISH EXPENDITURE DURING AN ECONOMIC STANDPOINT.

A Claim That as Extravagance or Luxury Increases at the End of the Social Scale Poverty and Misery Are Augmented at the Other.

Special Correspondence. I found in a six month old number of The Social Economist an article by Mr. Ellis Meriam in which he takes a serious and thoughtful view of the luxury which does not seem to be logically correct.

The fact is recognized that false economy is characteristic of many who even speak authoritatively on this subject. The confounding of ethics, morals and economics is a common error. And unless we can agree regarding the domain of each, any discussion will doubtless be very unsatisfactory.

Put as tersely as possible, our duties lie in the domain of ethics, general public opinion and the economic of the day. The questions of general public opinion and questions of material self interest pertain to economics.
