WALKER IN ARMS AGAINST CHICAGO INVADERS.

A Chicago Concern Attempts to Pipe the Celebrated Mineral Water to the Windy City—The Whole Town Turns Out to Repel the Invaders by Force.

WALKER, Wis., May 9.—Waukesha is patrolled by armed men today and every loyal citizen has a weapon within arm's reach prepared to salify forth at a moment's notice in the event of the city.

The citizens had received an intimation of the proposed invasion by telegraph from Chicago, and when the train pulled into a crowd of 200 men was on hand to receive the invaders.

The workers, led by J. E. McElroy, stepped from the cars by the side of the street and aimed the curses of the crowd, were taken to the World's fair grounds.

An injunction was served on Mr. McElroy and he repaired to a hotel to confer with his attorney.

By the afternoon and a majority of the citizens decided upon a course of vigilance and are prepared for any emergency.
