

CHARMAN H. C. FRICK

He Seems to Be Doing Very Well. He Will Not, However, Be Able to Get Out for Several Weeks.

Pittsburg, July 25.—Chairman Henry C. Frick of the Carnegie company did not come down to his office this morning, as he jokingly assured his associates that he would when he was carried to the ambulance on Saturday night.

Reports from his residence are to the effect that he passed a restful night, despite the closeness of the atmosphere. His extraordinary vitality was strikingly demonstrated yesterday, for although he never left his bed, yet that Pittsburg has experienced in nearly 10 years, his wounds gave him apparently little trouble, while mentally he was bright and active.

Physicians were examined and dressed this morning, but there was not the faintest trace of blood poisoning, or of any greater amount of inflammation than would be expected under the circumstances, and the results of the treatment were decidedly encouraging, both to his surgeons and their patient.

As to the future of the sufferer, the surgeons say that it will not be possible for him to leave his bed even to walk about the room for a month or two at the earliest. It may be longer, but unless blood poisoning or some other spread, he will be able to get up and walk about in a few days.

Three hundred dwellings, forty sub-tenement blocks, four hotels and two large mills have been destroyed.

Much alarm is felt for Mrs. Frick, who became a mother 10 days ago. Her nursing maid, who will inform him that he would die before the next day. He passed it over to one of his assistants, who said: "I have had twenty-four hours to live."

In addition to the three bullet wounds, Mr. Frick was stabbed twice, in the neck and in the calf of the left leg. The latter cut, which almost severed the tendon, was not discovered by the doctors yesterday.

Mr. Frick will continue in control of the Carnegie company, unless an unfavorable turn should be taken. He will continue to direct the course of the struggle at Homestead from his home in this city.

He has taken all possible precautions to prevent any person from obtaining access to him, and has positively refused to answer any telegram or letter which was communicated with affairs at Homestead.

He has preserved the same attitude toward all members of the American legation here, and other persons in London, who have not heard a word from him since the beginning of his troubles at Homestead.
