

THE BAY CITY FIRE

Four Hundred People Are Homeless.

The Loss Now Estimated at About Half a Million Dollars.

Bay City, Mich., July 26.—Where yesterday stood 400 buildings, occupied as factories, stores and dwellings, this morning lay a scene of a smouldering heap of ruins. Dense clouds of smoke rendered it impossible to fully comprehend the immense damage done and the extent of the burnt territory laid waste, but this morning the smoke has cleared and the full extent can now be seen.

The fire burned a swath about six blocks wide from the river bank almost to the city limits, a strip of five blocks, occupying everything in its path and only was it stopped when the houses nothing for it to feed upon, the houses having become scattered.

At 10 o'clock this morning the charred remains of a man were found. They were among the ruins of the house owned by Jesse Miller, and are supposed to be those of the owner. Miller started for his house when the fire broke out and has not been seen since. It is also reported that five or six children are burned, and the ruins are now being cleared up. It is known that one man was killed before she could be removed.

The loss figures up about \$500,000. The buildings were largely small frame houses, occupied by laborers. The loss is not expensive, but the tenants lost. Over 400 people are homeless. Outside aid will not be asked.

AT HOMESTEAD
