**CLEVELAND AND NELSON.**  
 There is no difference in politics between the Republican candidate for governor of Minnesota and the Democrat candidate for president. Kent Nelson voted for the Mills bill in congress and agrees with the Sherman Republican policy. The Mills bill was to Mr. Cleveland the embodiment of his ideas on tariff reform and Sherman's financial policy has his approval. If Mr. Cleveland was a citizen of Minnesota he could just as well be the Republican candidate for governor as Mr. Nelson for all the difference there is between them on public questions. If Mr. Nelson was a native born American he could just as well be the Democrat candidate for president as Mr. Cleveland, since he believes in politics just as does the ex-president.

Mr. Cleveland could very consistently go into Minnesota and stump for Nelson which is more than can be said for Harrison, and yet Nelson is running on the Harrison ticket against Harrison. This is just an incident in this campaign showing how near akin the Republicans and Democrats are, and how near a farce it is they are playing in pretending to be enemies. If Harrison would agree to step down to give Cleveland the term upon condition that Harrison is to have the next time, and that in the meantime Cleveland is to give half the offices to the Democrats and let the Republicans keep half, there would be no need of spending four or five million dollars to make the campaign hot until November.

**HOGHTALING'S DEATH.**  
 Mr. Houghtaling is dead. He was killed on the street railway. Was that killing unavoidable?  
 There can be no question but that he was seen on the track by the motorist in time to stop the car. The car's bell was sounded perhaps, but the facts are the man did not get off the track. It might have been inferred that the man could not hear the warning or intended to get killed. In either case, the car should have been stopped. The street railway has no right to kill a man because he will not heed a warning bell.

If the cars had such headway that they could not be stopped in time to prevent death, it would be different. But the motorist had no right to presume the man would get off the track in time if he did not give heed to the first sounds of the alarm. The speed of the cars should have been slackened and the train so well as command that it would have been stopped within a few feet of the person endangered. Human life is of such value that it should be considered more consequence than the rapid transit of the people. Everything done in this city should be subject to the sacredness of life and liberty.

There are all kinds of people on our street; some are deaf, some blind, some careless and heedless, some insane and some drunk. All these have their rights, and not one is greater than the security of life.

**HARRISON MAY VISIT NEW YORK STATE**  
 Plans for a Great Political Week and a Grand Ending in the Metropolis.  
 New York, Aug. 23.—It has been decided by Chairman Rockefeller and Executive Chairman Hackett to ask President Harrison when he has completed his stay at Loon Lake to undertake a speech-making tour of the state. The subject was originally mentioned by Senator Hiecock, who urged it so strongly that it finally found favor with the state committee and the only thing now necessary to make it an assured fact is the consent of Mr. Harrison.  
 The state committee has laid the plan before the president, but no reply has yet been received from him. If he answers in the affirmative a special train will be chartered for the first week in September, and a schedule will be made for as much of the state as can be covered in a week. It will include hotel and sleeping car, and besides the president there will be speakers of national importance who can address the crowd from the rear platform when the president gets weary of talking.  
 At the close of the week the tour will terminate at Madison Square garden. A great demonstration will be prepared to give the president a reception which will surpass that accorded to Cleveland and Stevenson notification night.

**WOMEN OF THE PEOPLE'S PARTY.**  
 Much of the Movement's Success in Kansas is Due to Their Enthusiasm.  
 Annie L. Diggs writes in the Arena of the women who are influencing politics in the west, particularly in Kansas, that the revolution of the beginning of the revolution which overthrew ex-Senator Ingalls, she says:  
 Politics for the farmer had been recreation, relaxation or even exhilaration, according to the varying degree of his interest or of honor flatteringly bestowed by town committees upon a "solid peasant" at caucus or convention. The flash of pride over being selected to make a nominating speech or the sense of importance consequent upon being placed on a resolution committee to accompany the required document conveniently at hand—these high honors lightened much muddy plowing and hot harvest work.  
 But the farmers' wives participated in no such ecstasies. Hence for them no blinding party life. And therefore, when investigation turned on the light, the women spoke right out in meeting, demanding explanation for the nonappearance of the home market for the farm products, which their good husbands had been prophesying and promising would follow the upbuilding of protected industries. These women in the Alliance, grown apt in keeping close accounts from long economy, cast eyes over the long account of promises of officials managing public business, and said, "Promises and performance do not balance." "Of what value are conventions, or even elected dignitaries in the national Capitol, if homesteaders cannot be our children's heritage?"  
 The great political victory of the people of Kansas would not have been won without the help of the women of the Alliance. Women who never dreamed of becoming public speakers grew eloquent in their zeal and fervor. Farmers' wives and daughters rose earlier and worked later in grain time to copy the mottoes on the banners, to practice with the glue clubs, to march in procession. Each dwelling saying that woman is everywhere" was literally true in that wonderful picketing, speechmaking Alliance summer camps.  
 Before this question of the salvation of the imperiled homes of the nation all other questions, whether of "prohibition" or "tariffs" pale into relative insignificance. For where shall temperance or high thought of franchise be taught the children, by whom research the world is saved, if sacred hearth fires shall go out? The overtopping, all embracing moral question of the age is this for which the Alliance came. Upon such great ethical foundation is the labor movement of today building itself. How could women do otherwise than be in and of it?

**A Continued Orator in Colorado.**  
 The tour of General James C. Weaver, the People's nominee for president, across Colorado was a series of constant orations. In no campaign of any kind in this state has a candidate ever been received with so many and so genuine demonstrations of enthusiasm and so few platitudes and cant. In Denver he filled the largest auditorium in the city for two successive evenings, thousands finding it impossible to gain entrance to the coliseum. At Pueblo the special mineral palace could not hold the throng that flocked to hear him. At Leadville two meetings were necessary in order that the miners might hear the only candidate who is pledged to sign a free coinage bill. At Aspen the welcome given him by the Pitkin county miners surpassed anything ever seen in the way of a political demonstration in the state. At Grand Junction the farmers and fruit growers of the Grand valley gave evidence of their devotion to the silver cause by an enthusiastic greeting to the people's candidate. All along his route, at Canyon City, Salida, Buena Vista, Glenwood Springs and Newcastle, the People's nominee was received with the same hearty confidence and enthusiasm. No such triumphal tour was ever before undertaken by any political candidate in the Rocky mountain country.  
 Amid all these demonstrations General Weaver has borne himself with a courtesy and a dignity that has gained him the respect and confidence of his opponents. His speeches have been frank and able and manly. His arguments have made a wide impression upon the people of the state. They cannot be answered by calling him a "worn out politician" or a "demagogue."—Rocky Mountain News.

FLOWER EXPLAINS

New York's Governor Will He Ordered Out All the Militia.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 22.—In conversation with an Associated Press reporter, speaking in reference to the criticism that have been made on his action in sending so many troops to the front of the strike, Governor Flower said:

"Have you a brother among the militia at Buffalo? If you have you will know how to answer the criticism. The militia are the best of the country."

He is, in fact, a man of high character and active, intelligent young man, coming from proper homes and shops and business places. They devote time and energy and religiously a measure of their property, and in the event of an emergency, they are ready to go to the front as the present one. When the state calls upon them for service that has any element of danger in it, they are bound to obey their officers as by his command to militiamen that danger as far as possible. Certainly it would be a mistake to place these young men in a perilous position so long as it is possible to avoid it."

When the proper authorities are informed that the 3,000 militia of that locality were trying to protect themselves from a mob, it is necessary to place every man in constant danger, and when they asked for protection, they were given it. It is as well to protect property, the state could do no less than send enough troops to properly handle the situation, and so far as can be prevented all possibility of riot and bloodshed.
