New York, Aug. 28.—There seems to be a widespread disposition on the part of the Chinese to refuse to give any information, if possible, from compliance with the provisions of the new law compelling all laborers of that nationality...

It will be necessary for the Chinese to furnish, with descriptions of themselves, three photographs for future identification, one of which will be sent to Washington.

The local officials have already held one mass meeting at which the law was loudly denounced, and another has been called for the same purpose.
