PRIESTS AND SCHOOLS
The Catholic Church's Attitude Defined.
An Authorized and Official Statement From Mgr. Satolli.

St. Louis, Mo., Dec. 8.—The address of Mr. Satolli, as the representative of the pope delivered before the meeting of the archbishops in New York, has been made public. After declaring that the resolution of the council of Baltimore, exhorting Catholic parents to give their children to the schools, is still in force, he says that the Catholic church recognizes and desires that public schools should be established in every state; but the church shrinks from those features of the public schools which are opposed to the Christian religion. These objectionable features are: Because in the public schools a purely secular education is given—inasmuch as it excludes all teachings of religion, because teachers are chosen indiscriminately from every sect and no law prevents them from working the rule of the youth—so that they are at liberty to lend minds. Likewise, certain considerations seemed to impend from the fact that these schools, or at least in many of them, children of both sexes are brought together for their lessons in the same rooms.

Wherefore, if it be clear that in a given school, owing to the wise dispositions of public authorities, or the watchful presence of school boards and parents, the above named dangers to faith and morals disappear, then it is lawful for Catholic parents to send their children to these schools, to acquire the elements of letters and arts, provided the parents themselves do not neglect their most serious duty, and the pastors of souls put forth every effort to lead the children and train them in all that pertains to Catholic worship and life.

Goddard landed on the right eye and on Maher's body with both hands several times. The round fought all around the ring. The round ended in a draw.

CHILIAN TREATY

Egan's Treaty Confirmed by the Senate.
WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.—The senate, in executive session, has ratified the treaty with Chile, providing for the appointment of a commission to settle the claims of citizens of the United States against Chile, negotiated by Minister Egan in Santiago.

LITTLE JAKE'S DIVORCE

Govt Relative to the Signum Capitalist's Hotel Torment.
SAGINAW, Mich., Dec. 8.—The suit for divorce brought by Jacob Seligman, the famous midwest capitalist, better known as Little Jake, against his young wife is the center of the city's attention. It is the only divorce case that would have followed such a sensational denouement had it not been known for months that their marital relations were unpleasing.

The incompability of the couple has been the talk of Saginaw for some time so that mere rumor as to a legal separation, it is asserted, steps were once before taken toward a separation, but that a settlement was arrived at which caused the discontinuance of the suit. HALLOW, N. S., Dec. 8.—Investigation shows that the reported destination among the inhabitants of Yarus Bay, Halifax county, is true. GRESHAM KILLS THE INTERSTATE COMMERCE LAW
