Abstract: This collection of dairies are mainly those of Robert B. Loomis

> (1832-1907). Born in Maine, he moved with his family to Boston, Massachusetts at the age of six. He married Emily Goodhue with whom he fathered four children. From 1862 to 1866, he lived in Washington D.C. and then moved to Grand Rapids, Michigan where he ran his own business and was involved in church, civic, and state affairs. He died in Grand Rapids, Michigan in 1907. His diaries document his business activities, personal life and historical events, most notably the assassination of Abraham Lincoln. The collection also includes a smaller number of diaries kept by Loomis' daughter, Sarah J. Loomis (1857-1907), called Jennie. Born in Boston, Massachusetts Jennie moved to Washington DC at age five with her family and then to Grand Rapids in 1866. Jennie never married and spent the remainder

of her life in Grand Rapids. She died in 1907.

Biographical / Historical

Robert B. Loomis was born February 25, 1832 in Lincoln County, Newcastle, Maine. He was born to Abner and Susan (Holten) Loomis. In 1838, at the age of 6, his parents moved their family to Boston, Massachusetts, where Robert B. Loomis received his early education. He married Emily Goodhue July 10, 1856 with whom he fathered four children. From 1862 to 1866, he lived in Washington D.C. where he was engaged in the mercantile boot business. In 1866 Loomis moved to Grand Rapids, Michigan where he continued working in the boot and shoes business with George R. Mayhew. He transitioned to working in fire insurance when he opened his own firm, R.B. Loomis & Co. in 1881.

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Loomis was also a prominent figure in church, civic, and state affairs. He was a charter member of the Fountain Street Church, organized in 1869, president of the mission board, and spent 40 years as a deacon in the church. He was a supervisor of the Calvary Baptist Church's mission sunday school, as well as the supervisor of the second ward from 1877 to 1896, the chairman of the county board of supervisors, chairman of the building committee, and on the county board of auditors. In 1896 Robert B. Loomis was elected as state senator and re-elected a second time in 1899. He died from pneumonia on January 16, 1907 in Grand Rapids, Michigan and was buried in Oakhill Cemetery.

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Biographical / Historical

Sarah Jane Loomis was born in Boston, Massachusetts on April 2, 1857 to Robert B. Loomis (1832-1907) and Emily Goodhue (1826-1899). At age five Jennie, as she was called, moved from Boston to Washington DC with her family and in 1866 the family left Washington DC to relocate in Grand Rapids, Michigan. Jennie spent the remainder of her life in Grand Rapids.

The eldest of four children, Jennie had a brother and two sisters; William H. (1859-1929), Emily S. (1860-1854) and Alice F. (1868-1918).

Jennie was a life-long member of the Fountain Street Baptist Church and worked as a stenographer. She never married nor did her sisters. They lived together at the family home at 102 (later 126) Barclay.

Jennie died May 19, 1907 of pneumonia, four months after her father's death from pneumonia.

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Scope and Contents

The bulk of the collection is made up of the diaries of Robert B. Loomis (1832-1907) dating from 1852-1906. His diaries describe the weather, business transactions and his daily activities. They also include newspaper articles, folded to fit in between the small pages. A smaller portion of the collection are the diaries of his daughter Sarah J. Loomis (1857-1907), called Jennie. Her diaries date from 1878 to 1903 and, like her father's, often describe the weather, people she came in contact with and daily events. The collection also includes the Will of Robert B. Loomis.
